Located on the campus of Alabama Southern Community College is a fountain paying tribute to writers from Alabama.

Take a photo of the fountain located in front of the library. The names of Harper Lee & Truman Capote must be visible in the photo.

**3) Brock, OH 492 points 24 hours ANNIE**

Annie Oakley was a famous sharpshooter and entertainer in the late 1800s. However, she was not so famous that the winner of Butt Lite II didn't know who she was. What was his name again?

Get a photo of the grave of Secret Celebrity Annie Oakley. Follow the sign pointing to "Annie Oakley's Grave" to the historical marker entitled "Annie Oakley" and you can probably find it.

**4) Atlanta, GA 116 points 24 hours ANTIG**

Roger Babson hated gravity. He established the Gravity Research Foundation to find a way to defeat it. To keep his dream alive he had monuments erected at many college campuses in the early 60's. The one at Emory University is a little hard to locate, but it's still there in its own little plaza behind the Math & Science building.

Coordinates are for the monument which is reached by a trail, up a hill & through the woods to the back of the Math & Science building. Street coordinates from Oxford Road are 33.78973 -84.32748. Use caution after dark. While this is a 24 hour bonus, it will be very difficult to locate at night. Also, campus police probably won't be too understanding about strangely dressed motorcyclists traipsing around in the woods after dark.

When atheists lost their lawsuit to have the Ten Commandments monument removed from the “free speech” zone in front of the Bradford County courthouse, they were allowed to erect their own monument. This is the first monument to atheism on government property in the United States.

Take a photo of the American Atheists monument.

Harper Lee, author of the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, To Kill a Mockingbird, was born and raised in Monroeville, AL. Atticus Finch, the central character, was voted by the American Film Institute to be the greatest hero in American film. Lurleen agrees. This monument in honor of Atticus was erected in 1997 by the Alabama Bar Association. It presents Atticus as the ideal model for nondiscriminatory justice.

Take a photo of the Atticus Finch monument.

The Chattooga River runs along the border between northeast Georgia and northwest South Carolina in the Blue Ridge Mountains. The Chattooga is designated as a national Wild & Scenic River. It was made famous in a book by James Dickey, Deliverance, and a movie by the same name. Lurleen has spent many days on the rapids of this amazing river. And the locals around here are quite friendly. But if you hear banjo music you may want to move along.

Take a photo of the stone marker designating the Chattooga River as “Wild and Scenic”. It is located near the trail to Bull Sluice, a class 5 rapid loved by kayakers & rafters. Enter the parking lot on the SC side of the river on US 76.

Barbie Beach began as a tribute to the gold-medal women's beach volleyball team during the 2006 Olympics. Now it is an ever changing "art piece" featuring Barbie, Ken & friends.

**9) Barrington, IL                      101 points                      24 hours                      BARRING**

In the early 1930s criminals like John Dillinger, Bonnie and Clyde, Pretty Boy Floyd, and Baby Face Nelson robbed, shot and killed their way across the heartland of America in an unprecedented crime spree. Eventually they all met their fate. In 1934 the FBI attempted to arrest Baby Face Nelson in Wisconsin, and an FBI agent was killed in the gun battle. The manhunt continued. Later that year, FBI agents caught up with Nelson in Wisconsin again. They chased him into Illinois, and in a blazing firefight near Barrington IL, two FBI agents and Nelson were mortally wounded. Nelson's body was found the next day near Skokie, IL, where it had been dumped on the side of the road by his fellow gangsters.

Take a photo of the memorial marker to the FBI agents who tracked down Baby Face Nelson.

In 1790 foolish white settlers moved here and built an unprotected fort, despite the presence of hostile Indians. In 1791 the hostile Indians duly massacred the foolish settlers. Years later the state erected a marker commemorating the foolish settlers.

Take a photo of the official Ohio Historical Marker for the Big Bottom Massacre.

Several monuments at this site commemorate the starting point for the survey of all the public lands in the midwestern and western United States.

Get a photo of the stone obelisk at the PA/OH state line. According to at least two of the markers at this site, how many feet south of this site was the Point of Beginning?

**12) White Castle, LA        361 points                      24 hours                      BELLEG**

One of the grandest pre-Civil War plantation houses, Belle Grove was 62 feet high, 122 feet wide, 119 feet deep, and contained 75 rooms, its own jail cell, and the first bathtub in the South. The house sat vacant and deteriorating from 1925 until 1952, when a mysterious fire burned what remained of the grand house to the ground.

Take a photo of the “Belle Grove Plantation” historical marker.

Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow were two of the most legendary outlaws of the gangster days of the Great Depression. 80 years ago, they met their fate, ambushed by lawmen, on a quiet road south of Gibsland. A stone marker has stood at the site for years, slowly being chipped away by vandals, souvenir hunters, and random gunshots. This year a new concrete and metal marker was erected which one hopes will fare better than the stone marker.

Get a photo of the new concrete and metal marker at the Bonnie and Clyde death site.

The International Bowling Museum & Hall of Fame collects, preserves and exhibits the 5,000 year history of the worldwide sport of bowling.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of TeamStrange (perhaps you've heard something about this?) Anyway it all started as a bowling team with the infamous "Fuckball" - a ball with no holes.

The good people at the bowling museum are looking forward to your visit. They even have a special place for you to park your bike - in the lot adjacent to "Road to Six Flags". Purchase a museum ticket in the gift shop. Make your way to the "mini-lanes" in the museum. You will be greeted by friendly TeamStrange volunteers who will assist in getting you set up to bowl 5 frames on the mini-lane with mini-fuckballs. Once you have finished bowling 5 frames the TS volunteer will give you a scorecard that will include your rider number, bowling score, an International Bowling Museum sticker, date, time & volunteer's signature. Get a photo of the miniature Brooklyn Bridge (between the two white buildings). According to the plaque on the bridge tower, who donated the replica bridge to the community?

**18) Tiptonville, KY            555 points            24 hours            BUBBLE**

Kentucky Bend, also known as Bubbleland, is a quirk of geography. The border between Kentucky and Tennessee was intended to end at the Mississippi River, which is the border with Missouri. Unbeknownst to the surveyors laying out the border, the Mississippi River dips south of the border line, turns back north near New Madrid, and then turns south again on its way to the Gulf of Mexico. This near 360 degree bend created a piece of Kentucky that is not connected to the rest of the state and can only be accessed by passing through another state.

Take a photo of the stone marker for the Madrid Bend Families' Cemetery to prove you were one of the rare visitors to this isolated spot.

On the east side of Kentucky Bend Rd, 0.5 miles beyond the north end of TN 22. There's nothing else out there, you can't miss it. 36.50465, -089.49232

The memorial arch in downtown Cabool honors the town's citizens who served in World War I.

When the railroad abandoned this bridge, the town of St. Francisville IL converted it to a vehicular toll bridge so they would have a short cut across the Wabash River to Vincennes IN. The toll is only \$1, which has been leaving the town short on money for repairs.

Jones was raised near Cayce KY, hence the nickname Casey. Despite what the Grateful Dead said, there's no evidence that Casey was high on cocaine while driving that train.

According to the plaque on the monument, Casey died with his hand clenched to the what?

The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) was a public works program that put over three million young men and adults to work during the Great Depression of the 1930's and 1940's in the United States.

**38) Hornbeak, TN              143 points                      Sunrise-sunset                      CRAPPIE**

In 1811-12, the largest earthquakes in North American history shook the New Madrid fault in this area of Missouri, Kentucky and Tennessee. The earthquakes were so strong, they changed the course of the Mississippi River and created, destroyed and moved lakes and swamps. Reelfoot Lake was one of those lakes created by the earthquakes. Reelfoot Lake was also, until 2003, one of the few commercial fisheries for crappies, a member of the sunfish family regarded as one of the best-tasting freshwater fish. The lake is still highly regarded as a sport fishing site for crappies.

Take a photo of the large (not really giant) statue of a crappie in Reelfoot Lake - Kirby Pocket Recreation Area.

Take a ride on the Dorena-Hickman Ferry and get a receipt showing that your fare was \$5 for a motorcycle.

Dred Scott was a slave who sued for his freedom when he was taken to a Northern state where slavery was illegal. In probably the most notorious and repugnant decision in its history, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that Scott could not sue because persons of African descent were not citizens of the United States. The outrage over the decision and the perpetuation of slavery led to Southern succession and the Civil War.

Get a photo of the grave of Dred Scott.

The scene was filmed in an actual Southern cafe with actual local teenage girls and rednecks and deputy sheriff. Reportedly, just before filming the scene, Dennis Hopper told the locals that he and Peter Fonda had just raped a girl outside town, to get the locals realistically enraged. Today the cafe is gone but a plaque marks the location of the café from Easy Rider.

At 5:30 am on November 20, 1968, there was an explosion at the Consol No 9 mine that was felt 12 miles away. 78 of the 99 miners inside didn't make it out. After a week the mine was sealed with concrete to put out the fires that were still burning. Years later the mine was unsealed to try to recover the bodies, but 19 were never found. As a result of this disaster, Congress passed the Coal Mine Health and Safety Act, which strengthened safety standards, increased inspections, and gave miners workplace rights.

Get a photo of the black stone marker on the site of the disaster. The parking lot may be closed but the marker is accessible by foot.
