Three Lakes, WI
Park St. N. of Hwy. 45
Three Lakes is the home of Fred "Cy" Williams. Near the Three Lakes Informational Bureau is a wooden marker touting his accomplishments. Williams was the first player to hit 200 home runs and was the Home-Run King of the National League. According to the sign, who was he tied with in 1923 and how many home runs did each player hit that year? (NOTE: Need 2 answers for this bonus.)

N13870 Copper Peak Rd.
Copper Peak is the only ski flying facility in the Western Hemisphere, with another five in Europe. This superstructure rises 26 stories above the crest of the hill and is the largest of its kind in the world. There is an 800 -foot chairlift followed by an elevator to take you to a spectacular view of the Lake Superior Basin. According to the informational sign at the base of the structure titled Not Just Ski Jumping - SKI FLYING, how many stories is the elevator?

The Wabeno Logging Museum is right on WI-32 in Wabeno and hard to miss. Find the 1901 Phoenix Log Hauler. It is powered by four steam engines and weighs 18 tons. According to the sign on the engine, how much can it pull?

Bishop Frederic Baraga was known as The Snowshoe Priest because he would snowshoe 700 miles each winter between Native American villages. This 60 -foot-high shrine to Bishop Baraga has stood on this bluff since 1972. The snowshoes are 26 feet long, his cross is 7 feet high and the five arches represent Bishop Baraga's five missions. Place your flag on the informational plaque or the bench and take a picture of the Bishop Baraga Statue. From the parking area, walk the path across the railroad tracks to the statue.

Trenary Toast is twice baked bread with cinnamon sprinkled on top. It came over with the Finnish that settled in the area in the 1800s and has been baked in the Trenary Home Bakery since 1928. It's a simple recipe, sold in a plain brown bag and is delicious when dunked in coffee. (We sampled a couple of different flavors when scouting this rally.) Take a photo of your bike in front of the bakery and then go inside, purchase some Trenary Toast and get a receipt. If the Trenary Home Bakery is closed, go to the gas station/convenience store on the highway and buy a bag or two. Bring your receipt back to the scoring table. This bonus requires both a photo (with your bike) and a receipt..

The Hines Lumber Company was located at this spot that is now the Washburn Lakefront Walking Trail. Edward Hines purchased the Bigelow Brothers Mills in 1902 and went on to have a brilliant career in the lumber industry. The purchase from the Bigelow Brothers Mills included 200,000 feet of stumpage and a logging railroad. According to The Hines Lumber Company wooden sign, what was the length of the logging railroad? (NOTE: The coordinates will take you to the marker. Park your bike in the parking area by the boat ramp on Lake Dr. and follow the Washburn Lakefront Walking Trail about 145 steps to the Hines Lumber Company historical wooden sign.)

The first school in Gay was built in 1902 and, after it became overcrowded, a new six-room, two-story building was built in 1927. The new school became a center of the community until the mills closed in 1932. By 1959 only 25 students attended the school and it was closed in 1961. Restoration began in 2009 and the historic school is now a museum, telling the story of the town of Gay. Find the bronze plaque mounted on a rock at the foot of a tree in the yard just to the right of the school (kitty-corner from the iconic Gay bar). According to this plaque, what happened on this site in 1897 ?

We saw the coolest thing when scouting this bonus last fall. Apparently monarch butterflies by the thousands hang out here on Stonington Peninsula waiting for favorable winds to cross Lake Michigan on their 1900 mile journey to the Sierra Madre Mountains of Mexico. It should be very quiet when you visit. The Peninsula Point lighthouse was built in 1865 of Cream City Brick from the Milwaukee area. The National Ski Hall of Fame and Ski Museum is located in Ishpeming because of the town's historic role in developing skiing in America. The first ski club in Michigan formed here in 1887. According to the historical marker titled Ishpeming: Historic Ski Center, this city has produced many famous ski jumpers. Where did they gain their experience?

This bonus was part of the 2015 TeamStrange Grand Tour. "Whispering Giants" are the work of Artist Peter Wolf Toth and are wood carvings honoring Native Americans from the area. All are done manually with hand tools, completed on-site out of a single log. Your rallymasters have visited several, including the one in Valdez, Alaska. Completed in 1977 and located in front of the Hayward Carnegie Library, this Whispering Giant honors the Ojibwa. Take a photo of the Whispering Giant.

From the turnout on Hwy 210, take the wooden stairs to the Thomson Pioneer Cemetery. Just beyond the top step is a marker for Charlotta Torin. The marker includes a poem by Thomas Gray and at the bottom is the date of her death (at the young age of 27). What is the date of Charlotta Torin's death?

The view from the overlook at Lake of the Clouds is phenomenal. Park in the parking lot and head on up to the overlook. At the overlook is an informational sign detailing the ecosystem and the geology of the escarpment. According to this sign, what was the name of the lake before being renamed to Lake of the Clouds in the early 1930s? There is a $\$ 9$ fee for a non-resident daily pass at the entrance.

Go inside, they're expecting you. One of your rallymasters attended high school in Crosby, MN, home of Trail-A-Sled, better known as Scorpion. There are two Scorpion models on display at the World Snowmobile Headquarters Museum. One is a 1968 classic black and red "tear drop" hood and the other is a 1980 Sno Pro racing sled campaigned by Brad Huling. Take a photo of each Scorpion snowmobile.

According to the Michigan Historical Marker titled Sand Point Lighthouse, U.S Congress authorized construction of the lighthouse in 1864, shortly after the railroad began hauling Iron Ore from the mines to the docks of Escanaba. The newly appointed keeper, John Terry, died just before the opening of the light. What is the first and last name of the person who lit the lamp for the first time?

Follow the path from the parking lot to the collection of informational signs and locate the sign titled The Frank Matthews Story. Frank was instrumental in the opening of the museum and has many artifacts on display. He was able to participate in the groundbreaking ceremony but died before construction was complete. Frank Matthews is second from the left in the photo of the groundbreaking. What was the date of the Michigan Iron Industry Museum groundbreaking?

Connie's Coffee is a snack shop conveniently located at a gas station in the scenic town of Ontanogan. They serve up coffee, espresso, subs, sandwiches and wraps, assorted treats and ice cream. Purchase a Yooper Chocolate Bar or two and bring your receipt to the scoring table.

On the front lawn of the Chamber of Commerce is a giant War Eagle statue. "OLD ABE" was the mascot and vanguard of Company C of the $8^{\text {th }}$ Wisconsin Infantry during the Civil War. Behind the statue you'll find an information display titled "OLD ABE."
