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**1) Calpatria, CA                      SAL                                      24 hours                                      966 points**

Leonard Knight decided to build a hot air balloon to evangelize his new-found religious faith. That failed. Having moved to Slab City, an abandoned military base and squatters community in the Sonoran Desert, he started piling cement on a large rock and painting it. It turned into a mountain, which collapsed. Taking this as a sign, Leonard built his second mountain, which now stands 50 ft tall and 150 ft across, is covered in tens of thousands of gallons of paint, and attracts visitors from all over the world to spread Leonard’s message that God is Love.

Take a photo of Salvation Mountain, or, if it’s too dark, of the plaque on the historical marker for Salvation Mountain, or, if you can’t get to that, of the colorful sign for Salvation Mountain at the entrance to the parking lot. Be advised that everything off the road is sand.

Beall Rd. From Hwy 111 in Niland, follow Main St and Beall Rd east.

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**2) Colome, SD                              OUT                                      24 hours                                      530 points**

When Eddie James used this unusual museum as a Butt Lite 5 bonus (remember the Deep Hole?) it was located in nearby Gregory. It was moved to its present location in Colome in 2016 and now has an even larger display of outhouses.

Take a photo of the Hillary Donald Outhouse.

The museum is located on a very narrow and very rutted alley running parallel to Main Street between 2nd St and 3rd St. Parking at either end and walking to the museum is advised.

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**3) Mexican Hat, UT                      GUM                                      24 hours                                      577 points**

“Run Forrest Run!” So he did. He ran all the way to the Pacific Ocean. And then he ended his cross country run right here. And there is a sign to prove it.

Take a photo of the Forrest Gump sign.

US 163. The handmade sign that says “Forrest Gump Ended his cross country run at this spot 1980” stands at a turnout approximately eight miles southwest of Mexican Hat.

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**4) Liberal, KS                      PAN                                      24 hours                                      489 points**

Liberal is the home of the International Pancake Race. Held on Shrove Tuesday, the race has been going for 500 years in Olney, England. In 1950, Liberal challenged Olney and now each year the towns hold a 415-yard race to determine the fastest runner who can also flip a pancake.

Take a photo of the marker at the Official Starting Line of the International Pancake Race.

Corner of Kansas Ave and Sixth St, on the library grounds.

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**5) Pie Town, NM                      PIE                                      24 hours                                      812 points**

The Pie-O-Neer café has been serving pies since the 1920's. They have pretty limited hours these days but hopefully they'll be open when you come by.

Take a photo of the "Pie Town, NM" sign on the Pie-O-Neer building.

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**6) Encampment, WY                      EDI                                      24 hours                                      653 points**

Thomas Edison camped near this spot in 1878 while on a fishing trip. It was here that his attention was directed to the fiber from his bamboo fishing pole which he tested as a suitable filament for his incandescent electric lamp.

Take a photo of the Thomas Edison monument, the plaque with the text above.

Hwy 70, at the overlook 14 miles west of Encampment.

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**7) Echo Bay, NV                      PCO                                      24 hours                                      1,221 points**

On Aug. 30, 1869, Major John Wesley Powell landed at the mouth of the Virgin River, about 12 miles south of here, thus ending the first boat expedition through the Grand Canyon of the Colorado River. For three months Powell and his men endured danger and hunger to explore and survey the geology of the canyons along the Green and Colorado Rivers. Exhausted and near starvation, the Powell party was warmly greeted and fed by the hardy Mormon pioneers of St. Thomas, a small

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farm settlement about 11 miles north of here. The original sites of St. Thomas and the junction of the Virgin and Colorado Rivers are now beneath the waters of Lake Mead.

Take a photo of the Powell of the Colorado historical marker

Echo Bay Road. The marker is on the far east side of the boat launch parking area.

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### **8) Rustic, CO                      POU                      24 hours                      744 points**

Poudre Canyon is a narrow, forty-mile canyon on the upper Cache la Poudre River. The canyon was inhabited by Utes in the 1800s and visited by trapping expeditions as settlers arrived. The relative lack of mineral resources in the area spared the canyon from significant development.

Take a photo of the large wooden map of Poudre Canyon.

Hwy 14, under a small shelter by the parking area at the Glen Echo Resort gas and liquor store.

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### **9) Wilhoit, AZ                      MLC                      24 hours                      887 points**

The Burro Saloon is a popular stop with bikers on Hwy 89 about 15 miles southwest of Prescott. You'll have to purchase something if you want to use their restroom.

Take a photo of the Malvina Lode Mineral Survey No. 4158 plaque.

8355 S Hwy 89. The plaque is attached to the outside wall of the Burro Saloon.

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### **10) Freedom, OK                      OTJ                      24 hours                      515 points**

Nestled in the pretty Cimarron River valley, Freedom maintains an old-style cow town look, with most of the buildings constructed from native cedar. The original town pump house was converted into a replica of a U.S. Marshal Oklahoma Territory jail.

Take a photo of the jail which includes the "U.S. Marshal Oklahoma Territory" on its west side.

Main St at Sandbur Lane.

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**11) Kelso, CA                      KEL                      24 hours                      673 points**

From the mid-1940s to 1985, this two-cell, strap-steel jail was used to confine drunks and other unruly individuals for a night or two. The jail was removed from Kelso in 1985 and ended up in the backyard of Ron and Kay Mahoney in Barstow. Kay donated it back to Kelso 20 years later.

Take a photo of the Kelso jail.

Kelso Cima Rd, near the Kelso Depot visitor center.

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**12) Wilson, KS                      TOB                      24 hours                      391 points**

Constructed in 1907, this water tower serviced area residents and shops. In 1956 the bottom floor was transformed into a small jail to hold prisoners until they could be carted off to the county jail. It served as a “prison” until 1963.

Take a photo of the Tobias Water Tower and Jail.

511 25th St. The water tower can be found behind the main strip of Avenue E in downtown Wilson, sitting next to a parking lot.

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**13) Salt Flat, TX                      PIN                      Daylight                      776 points**

Pinery Station was built as a relay station on the Butterfield Overland Mail stagecoach route at the crest of Guadalupe Pass. The station was built in 1858 but was abandoned the next year.

Take a photo of the Pinery Station ruins which includes the Butterfield Overland Mail-Pinery Station interpretive sign.

US 62/US 160, in Guadalupe Mountains National Park.

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**14) Oakley, KS                      THW                      24 hours                      500 points**

The Smoky Hill Trail was one of the most important overland trails across Kansas and was the shortest but most dangerous route through Kansas to the Rockies. Kit Carson, Wild Bill Hickok and General Custer’s 7th Cavalry all followed the Smoky Hill Trail in the 1860s.

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According to The Trail Heads West interpretive sign, one of several interpretive signs under the kiosk at the wayside, ~~how long was Monument Station occupied?~~

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**15) Guernsey, WY                      REG                      24 hours                      362 points**

Register Cliff was one of the key navigational landmarks for emigrants heading west in the 1800s on the Oregon Trail. Many of them carved their names into the soft sandstone cliff, and those names can still be seen today.

Take a photo of the Register Cliff historical marker.

Follow Wyoming Ave to Guernsey Rd. The last 0.5 mile is hard-packed gravel.

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**16) Hanksville, UT                      HOL                      24 hours                      550 points**

Hollow Mountain Gas & Grocery is carved right into a cave in the side of a really big rock.

Get a receipt from Hollow Mountain Gas & Grocery. The gas receipt is different from the in store receipt. We will accept either.

Take a photo of the receipt with your rally flag.

40 N UT-95. Gas is available 24 hours. The store is open 7 am to 9 pm, 7 days a week.

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**17) Interior, SD                      BAD                      Daylight                      873 points**

The Fossil Exhibit Trail in Badlands National Park tells the story of the link between many common modern-day animals and their prehistoric ancestors, including dogs.

Take a photo of the It's a Dog's Life interpretive sign.

Hwy 240 in Badlands National Park, five miles northwest of the Ben Reifel Visitor Center. Follow the boardwalk trail to the sign. There is a \$15 entry fee for motorcycles.

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**18) Willcox, AZ                      MAS                      Daylight                      1,244 points**

Chiricahua National Monument preserves the remains of an immense volcanic eruption that shook the region about 27 million years ago. The volcanic matter eventually eroded into these natural rock formations. Massai Point sits at 6,870 ft with an excellent view of the monument.

Take a photo of the Columns, Pinnacles and Balanced Rocks interpretive sign.

Bonita Canyon Drive at Massai Point, 5.7 miles from the visitor center.

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**19) Montezuma Creek, UT                      HOV                      Sunrise to sunset                      631 points**

Once home to over 2,500 people, Hovenweep National Monument includes six prehistoric villages built between A.D.1200 and 1300.

Take a photo of the Little Ruins Canyon interpretive sign showing the ruins in the background.

CR 268A, 0.5 mile from Hovenweep Rd and a short walk from the visitor center.

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**20) Canyon, TX                      PDC                      7 am to 10 pm                      900 points**

Palo Duro Canyon is the most spectacular landscape feature in the Texas Panhandle, formed by millions of years of water erosion by the Prairie Dog Town Fork of the Red River and the West Texas wind. In 1874, Native Americans who had left their reservations were camped here in the canyon, which led to a battle with U.S. government troops.

Take a photo of the Battle of Palo Duro Canyon historical marker.

Palo Duro Canyon State Park. There is an \$8.00 per person fee to enter the park.

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**21) Hutchinson, KS                      SSM                      24 hours                      425 points**

Salt was discovered here in 1887 when a land developer was drilling for oil. This bedded salt deposit is one of the largest in the world at 27,000 square miles.

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According to the Hutchinson & Northern Railroad marker standing next to Old No. 2, ~~how long was the shortest railroad in the United States?~~

Take a photo of the Hutchinson & Northern Railroad marker with your rally flag.

3650 E Ave G, in front of the Strataca Salt Mine museum.

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**22) Chama, NM                      CTR                      24 hours                      624 points**

The Cumbres & Toltec Scenic Railroad is a narrow gauge heritage railroad running for 64 miles between Chama and Antonito, Colorado. The rail line was constructed in 1881 to support mining operations. By the mid 20th century, ore traffic had dwindled and in 1970, Colorado and New Mexico purchased the recently abandoned line and reopened it as a tourist attraction.

Take a photo of the Chama railroad station which includes the sign with the town's name.

Off Terrace Ave in downtown Chama.

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**23) Durango, CO                      DOB                      24 hours                      599 points**

Two men made up a double-jack team. One turned the steel while the other pounded it. The holes they drilled were filled with blasting powder to break up the rock. Using an eight-pound hammer, this was wearying work. The double-jack team was later replaced by machine drills.

Take a photo of the Double-Jack Team sculpture.

Santa Rita Dr at US 160, by the parking area in Santa Rita Park.

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**24) Alliance, NE                      CAR                      Daylight                      442 points**

A family reunion in 1987 led to what has become America's best known version of Stonehenge. Carhenge was a bonus on leg one of the first Butt Lite. Bart remembers it well as he left his rally flag attached to one of the cars and didn't discover it was missing until he reached Amarillo.

Take a photo of Carhenge.

Hwy 87, three miles north of Alliance.

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**25) Dodge City, KS                    DOC    24 hours    484 points**

We seem to always have a Doc Holliday bonus. This one is a fine sculpture of Doc playing poker. All details are there including a gun hidden in a secret compartment under the table.

Take a photo of Doc Holliday playing poker.

NE corner of Wyatt Earp Blvd and 4th Ave. Park in the visitor center lot just behind the statue.

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**26) Ingalls, OK                    USM    24 hours    505 points**

A battle at Ingalls, Sept. 1, 1893, between a Dalton-Doolin gang and U.S. marshals was a climax in bringing law and order to Oklahoma and Indian territories. Three marshals and two residents were killed; several persons were wounded; one outlaw was captured.

Take a photo of the US Marshals monument.

Corner of 19th Ave and Ash St.

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**27) Circleville, UT                    BBH    24 hours    828 points**

Robert LeRoy Parker was raised by his Mormon pioneer parents on this ranch near Circleville. He changed his name to Butch Cassidy so as not to bring shame upon his honest parents. Butch Cassidy has become larger than life. His death is clouded in mystery - did he die in a shootout in Boliva with The Sundance Kid or did he move to the West to live out his life anonymously?

Take a photo of the log cabin where Butch Cassidy spent his childhood.

US 89, three miles southwest of Circleville. The short road to the cabin is unpaved.

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**28) Telluride, CO                    SMV    24 hours    789 points**

The 1889 robbery of the San Miguel Valley Bank in Telluride was one of the most brazen and daring bank robberies in Colorado history. Butch Cassidy and Matt Warner successfully got away with \$20,750, more than half-a-million dollars in today's currency. Cassidy and Warner picked up a fresh



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set of horses at this very spot and were pursued by a posse but escaped capture. The Telluride bank robbery is cited as a turning point in Warner and Cassidy's careers as outlaws. Because they had been identified, they began running from the law full time.

Take a photo of the San Miguel Valley Bank Robbery interpretive sign.

Hwy 145 at the Keystone Hill Overlook.

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**29) Baggs, WY                      BCC                      24 hours                      447 points**

Baggs was reputed to be one of the many former homes of the outlaws Butch Cassidy, the Sundance Kid and the Wild Bunch. The Gaddis/Matthews Cabin functioned as a road house and a Saturday night dance hall which Butch Cassidy and his gang were known to frequent.

Take a photo which shows the signage for the Cassidy House (Matthews-Gaddis Home) adjacent to the entrance to the cabin/museum.

Hwy 789/Penland St between Pine and Spruce St.

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**30) Fruita, CO                      BCG                      24 hours                      511 points**

From 1889 to 1904, Butch Cassidy and his Wild Bunch thrilled local citizens and terrified merchants and lawmen throughout the Grand Valley with their brazen bank, train and stagecoach robberies. Cassidy was known as the "Robin Hood of the West" for robbing from the rich and giving to the poor.

Take a photo of the large stone marker for Butch Cassidy in the Grand Valley.

I-70 Frontage Rd at the Colorado Welcome Center, halfway down the walk to the restrooms.

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**31) Yankton, SD                      JMC                      24 hours                      299 points**

Jack McCall, also known as Crooked Nose or Broken Nose Jack, was the murderer of Wild Bill Hickok. McCall shot Hickok from behind as he played poker in a Deadwood saloon on August 2, 1876. McCall was executed for the murder on March 1, 1877 at this location in Yankton.

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According to the Hanging of Jack McCall historical marker, ~~how long did it take McCall to die once the trap door opened?~~

Take a photo of the Hanging of Jack McCall historical marker with your rally flag.

Off 31st Street one block west of US 81.

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**32) Florence, AZ                      MIX                                      24 hours                                      527 points**

Tom Mix was Hollywood's first western star. He appeared in 291 films, all but nine of which were silent movies. Mix died on October 12, 1940 as he was driving between Tucson and Phoenix, when he swerved to miss some construction barriers and overturned in a gully. His neck was broken by an aluminum suitcase.

Take a photo of the Tom Mix monument.

Hwy 79, in the roadside park eighteen miles southeast of Florence.

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**33) Kingfisher, OK                      CHS                                      24 hours                                      373 points**

Jesse Chisholm was a mixed-blood Scottish-Cherokee fur trader most famous because of the namesake cattle trail, which he originally scouted and developed to supply his various trading posts among the Plains Indians in what is now western Oklahoma.

Take a photo of the Jesse Chisholm monument.

NE corner of US 81 and E Broadway Ave.

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**34) Taos, NM                                      KIT                                      6 am to 8 pm                                      1,051 points**

Kit Carson (1809-1868) was a frontiersman and scout on the Fremont Expedition, and the leader of Union-allied forces in New Mexico in the defeat of Confederates at the Battle of Valverde. He died on May 23, 1868 at the age of 59 at Fort Lyon in Colorado and was later re-buried here.

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Take a photo of Kit Carson's grave stone.

211 Paso Del Pueblo Norte, in Kit Carson Memorial Park and Cemetery. From the coordinates, it's approximately 175 yards to the grave; look for the historical marker which stands next to an opening in the fence. Keep to the right and the grave is a short distance, next to the flag pole.

**35) Fort Sumner, NM      KID                                  24 hours                                  560 points**

William H. Bonney (Billy the Kid) was a gunman and frontier outlaw who according to legend killed 21 men, his first at the age of seventeen. Billy the Kid is generally believed to be buried behind what is now the Old Fort Sumner Museum.

Take a photo of the Old Fort Sumner and Billy the Kid's Grave historical marker.

Next to the Old Fort Sumner Museum on Hwy 272.

**36) North Platte, NE      COD                                  24 hours                                  495 points**

Buffalo Bill Cody lived in North Platte for many years. He earned the name Buffalo Bill for the 4,280 buffalo that he slaughtered in one eight month period. The Fort Cody Trading Post claims to be Nebraska's largest souvenir and western gift store.

Take a photo of the ginormous Buffalo Bill Cody.

221 Halligan Dr, just north of I-80 in the parking lot for the trading post.

**37) Veyo, UT                                  MMM                                  Daylight                                  979 points**

In September of 1857, a wagon train of families heading to California were attacked by Mormon militia men. Fearing that they might be identified, the militia men decided to kill the pioneers by luring them into the open after showing a white flag. A total of about 120 men, women and children were massacred; 17 children under the age of 7 were spared and taken in by area families. Only one man was tried and convicted for the massacre.

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Take a photo of the large rock cairn at the Mountain Meadows Massacre memorial, a short walk from the parking lot. The photo **MUST** be taken in front of the cairn, not from the parking lot.

FR 375. It's one mile of gravel road from the pavement to the massacre memorial.

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**38) Meeker, CO                      MEM                      24 hours                      540 points**

This area was the site of the White River Ute Indian Agency where on September 29, 1879, U.S. government agent Nathan Meeker, a man with no experience with Native tribes, and ten of his male employees were killed by Utes fed up with Meeker's attempts to force them to take up farming, give up their pony racing, send their children to school and embrace Christianity.

Take a photo of the wooden sign with information about the Meeker Massacre.

Hwy 64, two miles west of Hwy 13.

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**39) Villisca, IA                      AXE                      Daylight                      612 points**

In the summer of 1912, an intruder bludgeoned eight people with an axe as they slept in this house. The victims were Joe and Sarah Moore, their four children and two visiting children. The murders were never solved.

Take a photo of the Villisca Axe Murder House.

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**40) Joshua Tree, CA                      JST                      24 hours                      1,095 points**

From the highest point in Joshua Tree National Park (5,185 ft) you can see the Coachella Valley, the San Andreas Fault, and on a clear day, Signal Mountain in Mexico.

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Take a photo of the interpretive sign at the overlook titled What’s Wrong With This Picture?

Keys View Rd. From either park entrance, follow the road through the park and take the marked turnoff for Keys View. Note that there is a short but steep climb from the parking area to the overlook where the bonus is located. If you are physically unable to do the climb, there is an identical interpretive sign at the accessible overlook area a bit down the road from Keys View. There is a \$25 per motorcycle entrance fee.

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**41) Joshua Tree, CA                    CHL    24 hours    925 points**

In the middle of Joshua Tree N.P. is a stand of teddybear cactus. Unlike Lyle T. Bear, you should not pet these teddybears. Their spines detach easily and are barbed so they go in but don’t come out. They are nicknamed “jumping cholla” because it is reputed that if you get near one, it will jump at you and sting you. Don’t test your Aerostich protection, stay away from the cacti.

Take a photo of the interpretive sign for Cholla Cactus Garden.

Pinto Basin Rd. From the south entrance of Joshua Tree National Park, drive 20 miles into the park to Cholla Cactus Garden Trail. There is a \$25 per motorcycle entrance fee.

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**42) Oatman, AZ                                    OAT    24 hours    758 points**

Oatman was founded around 1906 as part of Arizona’s richest gold mining area and was reborn in the late 1960’s as a tourist town. The main attraction was the wild burro herd. The burros roaming the Oatman area are descendants of the burros from earlier mining ventures.

Take a photo of the Oatman Arizona And Its Burros plaque which was placed here by Billy Holcomb and the Lost Dutchmen Chapters of the Ancient and Honorable E Clampus Vitus and the Oatman Chamber of Commerce on October 9,1994.

At the Main Street Candle Emporium.

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**43) Murdo, SD                                    BRA    24 hours    287 points**

Have you ever wondered how cattle brands are created? Probably not, but now you can learn all about it. This marker goes into great detail on what the various brands in the area mean.

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According to the Reading Brands marker, ~~the first Westover brand was registered to whom?~~

Take a photo of the Reading Brands marker with your rally flag.

At the rest area on Hwy 284 on the west side of Murdo.

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**44) Canadian, TX                      CAN                      Daylight                      609 points**

Construction of the Canadian River Wagon Bridge was completed in July 1916. It was said at the time to be the largest steel structure west of the Mississippi River.

Take a photo of the Canadian River Wagon Bridge interpretive sign.

US 60, in the city park at the start of the old bridge/where the road ends.

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**45) La Cueva, NM                      CUE                      24 hours                      723 points**

This mill was built in the 1870s by Vicente Romero. According to legend, Romero slept in caves while tending his sheep, thus the name La Cueva. Flour was ground and electricity generated by the mill until 1949. The mill is now part of La Cueva National Historic District.

Take a photo of the tall wooden sign for La Cueva Mill.

Hwy 442 just north of the intersection with Hwy 518.

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**46) Eureka, KS                      EUR                      24 hours                      416 points**

“Eureka, I’ve found it!” shouted a small band of hardy pioneers in August of 1857. Abundant drinking water was a strong factor in the search for a place to settle. They soon agreed that they had indeed found an ideal place and laid claim to the town site they named Eureka.

Take a photo of the stone marker at Eureka Spring.

Off US 54. There is a sign directing you to the spring on westbound US 54 just west of Elm St.

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**47) Old Glory, TX                      OLG                                      24 hours                                      707 points**

The town of Old Glory was settled by German families from southeast Texas who originally named the town New Brandenburg. The outbreak of World War I had an adverse impact on the town and a rise in anti-German sentiment caused residents to petition the U.S. Postal Service to change the town's name to Old Glory. The name change became official on August 9, 1918.

Take a photo of the Old Glory flag mural on the side of the building.

Corner of CR 126 and Hwy 128 Loop.

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**48) Liberal, MO                      LMO                                      24 hours                                      355 points**

Liberal was founded in 1880 by George Walser, an anti-religionist, agnostic lawyer and former state legislator who wished to create an atheist, "freethinker" utopia. Wasler purchased 2,000 acres of land and advertised across the country for atheists to join his town, which would "have neither God, Hell, Church, nor Saloon".

Take a photo of the sign for The Liberal News.

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**49) Rockville, UT                      GRF                                      Daylight                                      860 points**
